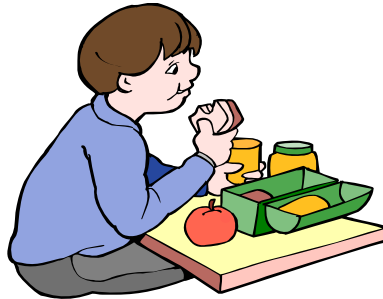


## Lunch Room Policy

Our goal is to provide our children with a **pleasant** and **safe environment** during the lunch hour. In order to accomplish this, every child is expected to follow these basic rules:

1. Children should eat their lunches at the assigned desks and tidy up. A special garbage can has been placed in every classroom for lunch garbage. Glass containers are not allowed.
2. Children should show courtesy and good manners to other children and to their lunch monitors. This includes listening to and following the instructions of the lunch monitors.
3. Throwing food or other objects in the classroom is not permitted. Similarly, yelling and running around in the rooms or the hallways is not permitted.
4. Children may not leave the classroom without the permission of the lunch monitors.
5. In the schoolyard, children are expected to play properly and have fun without interfering in the play of others.



Children who consistently create a situation that jeopardizes a pleasant lunch period may, after a series of warnings, lose the right to participate in the program.

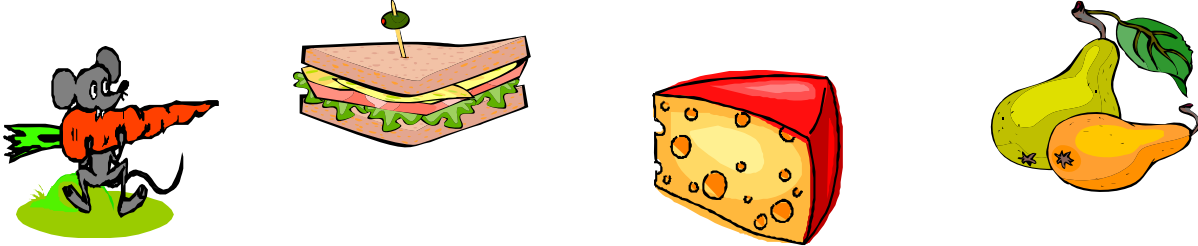
Since the children play outside for half the 60 minute-lunch period, it is important that parents check their children's clothing to be sure they are dressed appropriately for the weather.

Children will not be permitted to remain indoors unless there is a legitimate medical reason for which the parents have provided a doctor's note. A child getting over a cold or the flu should not be sent to school unless he/she is able to go outside to play.

If it is raining or very cold outside, the children will remain indoors with their lunch monitors. Games have been purchased for each classroom to be used on these days.

### Health and Nutrition

Please do not send "junk" food, such as potato chips, chocolate, etc., to school for snacks or for lunch. Teaching good nutrition is part of the school curriculum and we appreciate your cooperation in reinforcing this knowledge by sending in fruit, cut up vegetables, etc. Juices should be in a plastic container or waxed cardboard container. **Glass bottles are not allowed in the school or schoolyard. Only plastic utensils should be used.**



### Supplying Food to Students

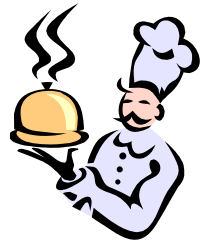
Students who forget lunches **on a regular basis** will not be provided free food after the third occurrence during the school year. The parent/guardian will be asked to pay a **2\$ fee** to cover the cost of a small snack after the third occurrence.

### Hot Lunch Program

The hot meal program is organized entirely by our food supplier. Any dealing/modification/ adjustment brought to your child's hot meal, as well as hot meal transfers to siblings/friends/ neighbours is not the responsibility of the school. If a change is required, the parent/guardian must inform the catering company **before 9:00 am.** Meals that are not eaten are not stored at school. Please remember that you are not to call the school concerning hot lunch matters.

### Lunchtime Supervision

Children eat lunch in the classrooms. Every classroom is supervised by lunchtime supervisor who remains with the students while they eat and then supervises them in the schoolyard for the rest of the lunch hour.



All of our supervisors have followed a certified first aid course to service our children.
