is a process that identifies your current competencies and determines any missing education or training components you need, thereby accelerating or giving you direct access to a **diploma**.

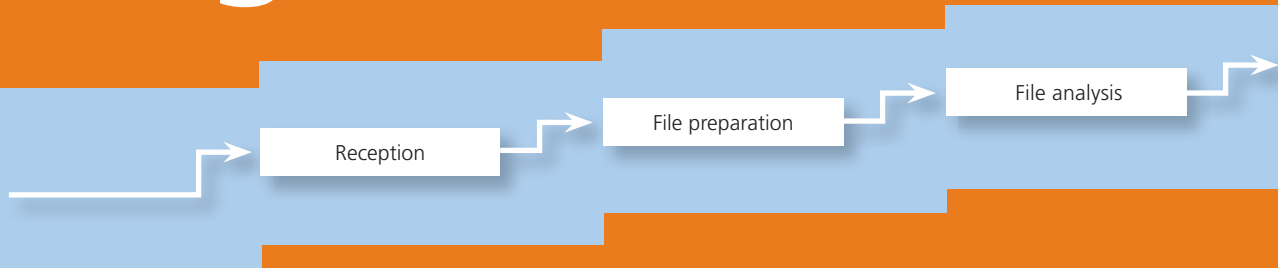
Is RAC for you?

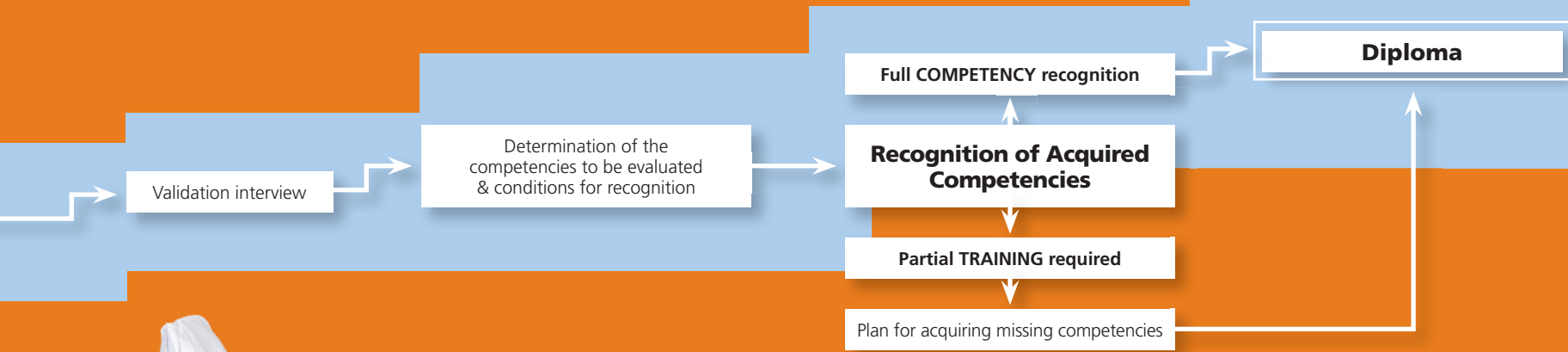
