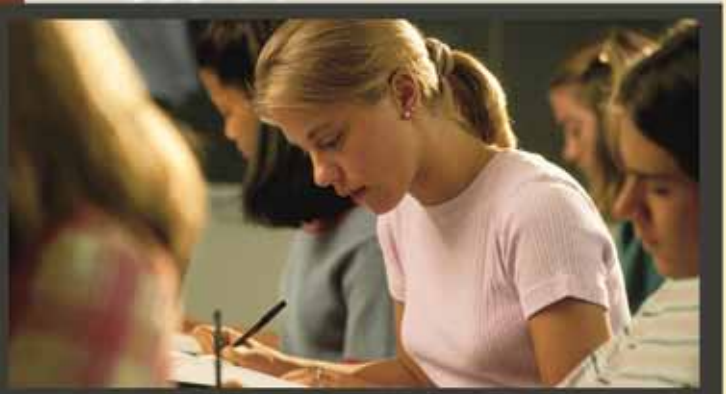

WELCOME TO THE EMSB

There was a time, not too long ago, when children attended the high school nearest to their homes. But these days, the school best suited for your child may no longer be around the corner. Parents and children should consider a number of factors when shopping around for the right school, such as its individual program, transportation facilities, and philosophy.

This booklet on the EMSB secondary school network will help you select the high school best suited to satisfy your child's particular needs and interests.

INTRODUCTION

■ The EMSB secondary school program consists of Secondary I to V (Grades 7 to 11) and it is divided into two cycles: Cycle I (Grades 7 and 8) and Cycle II (Grades 9 to 11).

Implementation of the curriculum reform began in September 2005. The Quebec Education Program is an important part of this reform. It is a system based on cycles. The multi-year cycle allows your child to progress according to his/her own learning rate. Based on a core education for all students, the first cycle of secondary school is of a two-year duration.

Cycle I is to be viewed as a transition for students progressing from elementary school to high school. Cycle II should be considered as the preparation for certification. Certain courses in this cycle are compulsory while others are optional.

PROGRAMS OF STUDY

■ The programs offered at both cycles are designed by the Ministry of Education, Leisure and Sports (MELS) and adapted by the School Board to meet the needs of our students. A variety of programs in both English and French are offered in our high schools.

Several French programs are available in high school and the amount of time complements the programs at the elementary level.

Secondary I, II and III have extended French programs, which vary from 38 to 72 percent. In Secondary IV, in addition to a French language course, students may take history in French (Histoire) and in Secondary V, students follow French language courses only.

We also offer an English Core stream. Students in this program receive their instruction in English with the exception of one course in French as a second language. However, in many schools, it is possible to take enriched French within the English Core Stream.

SCHOOLS WITH SPECIFIC EDUCATIONAL PROJECTS

■ Some high schools in the EMSB have specific educational projects. For example, Vincent Massey Collegiate, Royal West Academy and Royal Vale have enriched CEGEP preparatory programs, FACE focuses on the arts and Lester B. Pearson has a Sports-Études program.

Three EMSB schools: John Paul I, Laurier Macdonald and Marymount – have international programs; MIND offers an alternative program for students whose educational needs may not be met in regular high schools. John Grant and Paul VI service special needs students. Traditional and alternative high schools must follow the régime pédagogique (the curriculum set by the MELS). All students must fulfill the same credit requirements to obtain a high school leaving certificate. Please refer to the specific school descriptions in this guide for further information or go to the school websites.

ALTERNATIVE/OUTREACH HIGH SCHOOLS

■ The Alternative/Outreach High School Network gives students the opportunity to be successful in an alternative educational setting, allowing for them to experience different educational approaches, both unique and in tune with their varying needs. Eight schools offer a variety of programs for both English and French students. The system is designed to help students continue their studies in a less formal atmosphere. Some programs offer a high school leaving certificate, while others help students return to a regular high school setting. In some cases, students receive preparation for entering the general work force. For more information please visit the EMSB website.

VOCATIONAL PROGRAMS

■ The EMSB offers a variety of vocational programs to students who have completed the required prerequisites at the Secondary III or IV level or who have obtained a high school leaving certificate. Students who are interested should contact their Guidance Department for further information.

GUIDANCE SERVICES

■ Each school has one or more guidance counsellors to help new students adjust to the high school environment. Together with teachers and administrators, guidance counsellors help students make informed academic choices by clarifying which courses are available to students and explaining individual course requirements. Furthermore, they provide individual personal counselling, career information, employment opportunities and entrance requirements for CEGEPs and universities.

MULTICULTURAL/MULTIRACIAL EDUCATION SERVICES

■ The EMSB welcomes and respects the ethnic and cultural diversity of its students. Our goal is to foster mutual respect and understanding among the more than 100 cultural groups in the EMSB. School staff has been trained to develop a learning environment without prejudice, stereotyping or discrimination.

CAFETERIA SERVICES AND NUTRITION EDUCATION

■ Full cafeteria services are offered in most of our high schools. Trained dietitians and food technicians supervise cafeterias following the guidelines of the EMSB's nutrition policy. Our goal is to promote healthy eating habits among students. Accordingly, more nutritious food items are subsidized to encourage their consumption. A dietitian oversees various nutrition education programs in the curriculum, in courses such as biology, personal and social development, and home economics. SCHOOL LIBRARIES

■ Our high school libraries are open to students and staffed by qualified personnel. The school library supports the curriculum and encourages students to pursue extracurricular reading and multimedia research.

PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT

■ Parents are encouraged to take an active part in the education of their children by attending meet-the-teacher interviews. Since a child's teenage years can be filled with turmoil, the more you understand about school life, the better prepared you will be to help your child at this stage of his or her development. If at any time your child is encountering problems, or you are concerned about something, please call the teacher or an administrator. Parents are welcome to participate in schools as library volunteers, dance chaperones, Governing Board members, and Parent Participation Organization members or in a variety of other roles.



OPEN HOUSES

Most of our high schools hold open houses. Take advantage of the opportunity to see the facilities and to talk with the administrators, teachers, guidance personnel and students. Please take your son or daughter with you. It is important that he or she is involved in the decision-making process. Your child's temperament, interests, abilities, strengths and weaknesses should be considered when choosing a school. If he or she has special needs, ask what the school can do to address them. Since most high schools start their day between 8 a.m. and 8:30 a.m., you may also wish to take into account how long it will take your child to travel to a given school.

Location

Fine Arts Core Education (FACE) High School is located on University St. just north of Sherbrooke St. West, directly across from McGill University. It is easily accessible by buses #15, #24, #61, #168, the McGill Metro and Central or Windsor train stations.

Philosophy

John Grant is on the corner of Parkhaven and Kildare in Côte Saint-Luc. Buses #104, #161 and #162 stop near the school.

Philosophy/Objectives

John Grant High School, an alternative special education vocational centre, is devoted to the needs of students with mild to severe learning difficulties and offers a warm, supportive, multicultural environment and small class sizes. The school's goals vary according to the ability of the students involved: to assist students in developing his/her life and academic skills to the fullest and promote entry into the regular work force via extensive vocational and work study programs. Students who demonstrate academic ability and promise are encouraged to pursue further education in the Adult Education Sector. Several of our programs prepare students for independent living.

Programs

John Grant offers a modified academic program. Students receive a full range of non-credited academic subjects in the arts, science and technology, history and citizenship, languages as well as physical education, health & wellness and home economics in Cycle 1. There is also a fine arts program (music, art, dance and drama). The Pework oriented pathway will be introduced next year. This program begins for students who reach 15 years of age as of September 30 that academic year. This program leads to a Ministry accredited certificate, not a diploma, upon completion of the 3 years. Pework programs such as building maintenance, food services, grounds keeping and horticulture, cosmetology and early childhood care are offered and linked to work studies in the community.

John Paul I Junior High School is located in St. Léonard, north of Metropolitan Boulevard between Lacordaire and Viau. It can be reached by bus #192 from the Cremazie Metro, bus #32 from the Cadillac Metro, or bus #132 from the Viau Metro.

Philosophy

- ♦ **The Core Program** offers all subjects in English to the students, in this program we also have the flexibility to offer special resource if need be.

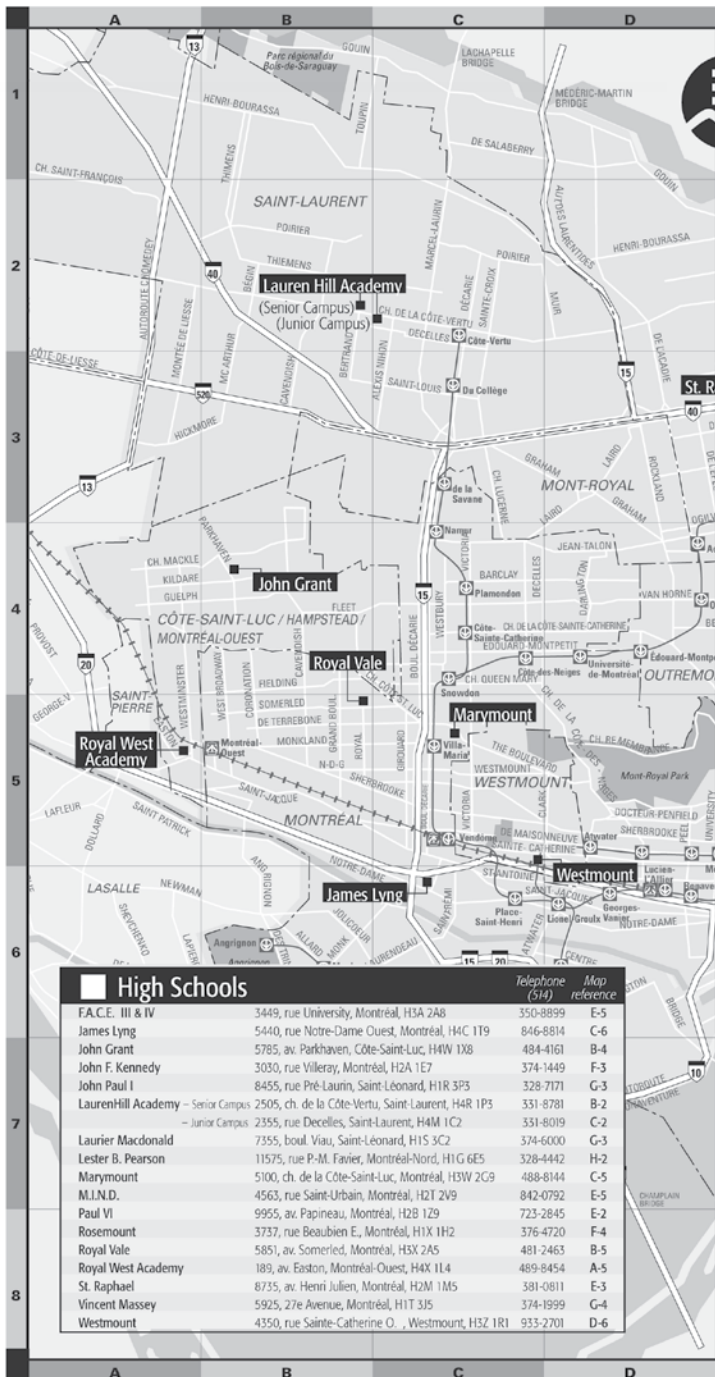

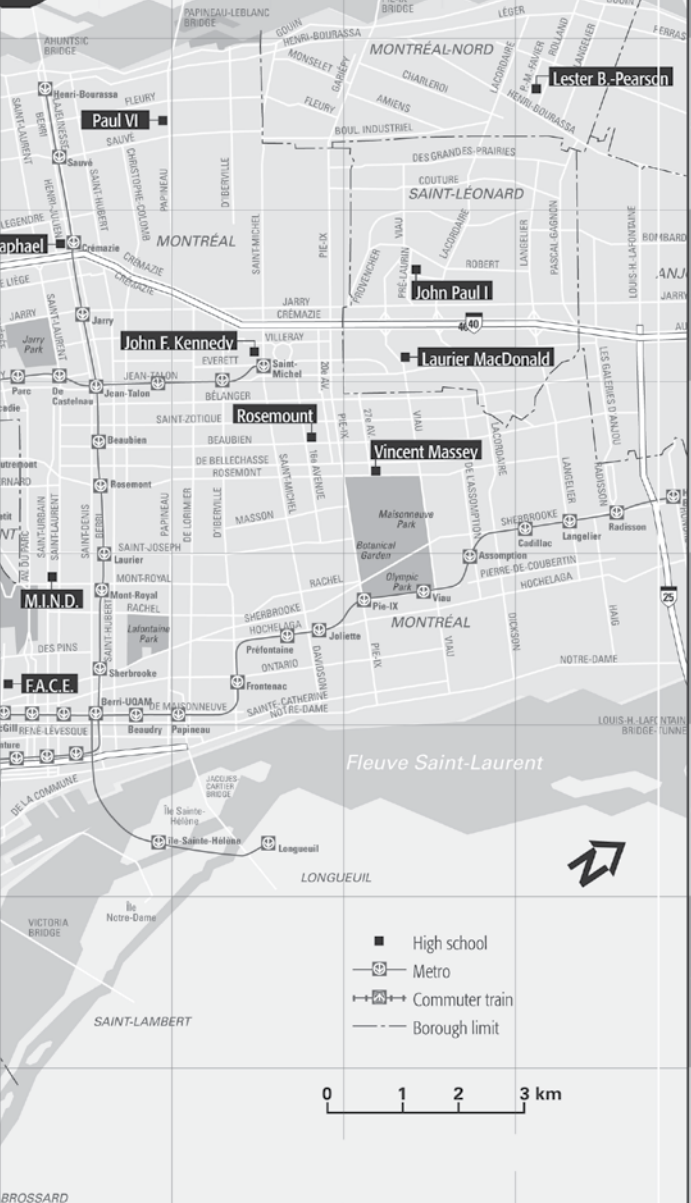

Location

Paul VI High School is located on Papineau Avenue in the Ahuntsic area in the same facility which houses the St. Pius X Adult Centre and Culinary Institute. It is easily accessible by bus #45 from the Papineau Metro and buses #121 and #140 from the Sauvé Metro.

Philosophy/Objectives

Paul VI is an alternative high school providing quality educational programs to students from 13 to 21 years of age who have been diagnosed with learning difficulties. Since its founding in 1979, Paul VI has offered a unique opportunity to students who find the regular high school setting inappropriate.

The school's goal is to ensure the academic, social, spiritual, and cultural growth of its students and to help them become contributing members of society. For some students, this may be in the regular labour market or in a sheltered workshop setting. For others, the goal is to reintegrate them into community schools.

Programs

Paul VI welcomes students from various school boards, both on and off the island of Montreal. It offers Individual Paths for Learning (IPL) for students in the following categories: moderately intellectually handicapped, mildly intellectually handicapped, severely learning disabled and multiple handicapped.

Students are grouped on the basis of their language, math, and social abilities, as well as their emotional maturity. Within these small groups, a holistic approach contributes to student growth. Student success is maximized through personalized instruction, computer-assisted modules and a variety of extracurricular activities.

The Prewrite oriented pathway will be introduced next year. This 3 year program begins for students who reach 15 years of age as of September 30 that academic year. This program leads to a Ministry accredited certificate, not a diploma, upon completion of the 3 years.

A model workshop area is incorporated within the school as a preparatory phase for students who cannot immediately enter the Work Study Program. Students in these programs receive "on-the-job" experience and are closely supervised by school personnel. Meanwhile, students in the Work Study Program receive actual on-the-job training four days a week. The fifth day is devoted to in-school follow up and remediation by a work study teacher. For students who are not yet ready for a four-day-per-week commitment, a one, two or three day program is arranged.



Support Services

Weekly multi-disciplinary meetings are used to review student dossiers together with reports from teachers, child care workers, guidance counselors, speech therapists, a social worker and a spiritual community animator. A student's grouping and the method of his or her instruction may be adjusted on the basis of these recommendations. This close monitoring and flexible instruction enables Paul VI to successfully re-integrate students into vocational programs offered by other secondary schools.

Philosophy/Objectives

RWA is an alternative high school with limited enrollment. St. Raphael Centre is located on the corner of Henri Julien and Crémazie. It is easily accessible from both the Crémazie metro and bus #100.

Philosophy / Objectives

St. Raphael offers a psycho-educational program (a blend of psychosocial, behavioural and educational programs) for students with behavioural difficulties as classified by the Ministry of Education, Leisure and Sports. The philosophy and mission of the psycho-educational program is twofold:

- Students take responsibility for their choices.
- Stress the importance of personal responsibilities, problem-solving techniques, confidence building and self-acceptance.

The school places the emphasis on the student's ability to learn the necessary coping skills to successfully reintegrate into the educational mainstream. While adhering to the integrity and basic standards of a regular academic program, the students receive specialized services for behavioural problems and a quality academic education. Admission to St. Raphael Centre is by referral. A complete referral package must be obtained from the sending school. Referrals should be made no later than May for admission the following September. A multi-disciplinary team will review each applicant's suitability for the program.

- ◇ Highly structured program based on behaviour modification, incorporating a successful well-adapted behaviour point system, social skills training and choice therapy.
- ◇ MDT (Multi-Disciplinary Team) approach, using a cross-section of teaching and non-teaching professionals.

- ◇ Ongoing parental involvement.

In addition, each student is assigned a teacher-advisor with whom the student meets at the end of each day.
