## September 8 is World Literacy Day

**FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL:** Students of the EMSB primary and secondary institutions will return to class on Tuesday, September 2, 2008. Kindergarten children must be five years of age on or before September 30, 2008 while Grade 1 (Cycle 1) students must be six years old on or before the same date.

Registration for those not previously enrolled is still underway. Parents are asked to call the school in their neighbourhood to make an appointment. E-mail inquiries can be sent to [informationdesk@emsb.qc.ca](mailto:informationdesk@emsb.qc.ca). A special information desk may also be reached by calling 514-483-7200. The EMSB serves more than 37,000 students at 38 elementary schools, 17 secondary schools, nine outreach schools, 11 social affairs institutions and 11 adult and vocational centres.

All pupils registering for the first time are required to provide a birth certificate and vaccination records to the school the child will be attending. Parents will be asked to fill out forms which will allow the school to apply for the certificate of eligibility for English schooling. Under the Charter of the French Language, a certificate of eligibility is generally granted to children who did the majority of their elementary or secondary studies in English in Canada; whose mother or father did the majority of his/her elementary

studies in English in Canada or whose brother or sister did the majority of his/her elementary or secondary studies in English in Canada. Please note that as a result of Bill 104, this criteria excludes studies completed in the Quebec Private School system.

**10<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY:** The EMSB will launch its 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations appropriately on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of the first month of classes. On Wednesday September 10 (from 10 a.m. onwards), elementary school students will parade around their neighbourhood streets, carrying special 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary flags while high school students will take part in walk-a-thons to mark the occasion. In the event of severe rain, these programs will be rescheduled to Friday, September 12.

A special 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary committee at the EMSB is co-chaired by Region 1 Director **Marzia Michielli** and Assistant Director of Human Resources **Connie Primiano**. Their committee has recommended that, whenever possible, a special activity occur on the tenth day of each month. In addition to the monthly activities, there will be three major events involving parents, employees and students.

Already, a special 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary commemorative edition of the *EMSB Express* tabloid newspaper has been published. A contest among students produced a theme song. In addition, a 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary logo,

designed by Rosemount Technology Centre student **Hi Ying Yi Li**, graces EMSB publications, the website and large banners which are to be displayed at every school and centre. Ms. Ying Yi Li was presented with a new iMac computer at the August 27 as an expression of appreciation for her fine work.

On September 10 at the Administration Building, activities will commence at 9:30 a.m. with addresses by EMSB Chair **Angela Mancini**, Director General Antonio Lacroce and a representative from the Ministry of Education, Sports and Leisure. The winners of the logo contest and the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary song competition will be introduced. Students from neighbouring schools will be in attendance as will representation from the adult sector and different unions. A plaque commemorating the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary will be unveiled in the foyer, with Ms. Mancini presiding. Everyone will then move outdoors for a ribbon cutting, symbolizing the brilliant future for the EMSB. At this point a time capsule will be deposited, next to the planting of a new red oak tree donated by *Pépinière Jasmin*, to be reopened in 10 years.

While all elementary schools in the system will parade around their respective streets waving flags, those closest to the EMSB Administration Building will rendez-vous there and be greeted by EMSB officials as well as Quebec Members of the National Assembly **Tony Tomassi** (Lafontaine) and **Russell Copeman** (N.D.G.). The EMSB's St. Pius X Culinary Institute will donate a giant birthday cake for the occasion. of graduating EMSB students so that they can pursue their post secondary studies at a CEGEP or in vocational education.

The EMSB had about 1,000 books to give away to students in the elementary schools. They used them as an incentive to encourage students to read during the summer months. **Before** June 23 students indicated how many books they were going to read during the summer months. Throughout the summer, they were encouraged to ask their parent(s) to take them to the library to take out books (in French or English). **Upon the children’s return** in the new school year, they will

give in the reading log showing the number of books read. It will be tallied by grade level, or another grouping of your choice. Every participating school will receive approximately 80 books as part of this initiative.

**CENTRAL STUDENTS COMMITTEE:**

The EMSB plans to establish its first Central Students' Committee, providing an opportunity for secondary students to meet on a regular basis. The mandate will be to: communicate issues and interests of concern to the students of the EMSB, improve communications between the school and the community, explore solutions that will produce an enriched school environment, develop leadership skills, participate in the EMSB consultation process and represent the students of the EMSB through recommendations to the Council of Commissioners.

**PUBLICATIONS:** A special 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary edition of the EMSB Express Newspaper will be sent to schools soon for distribution. It is already posted in the Press Room and 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary sections of the EMSB website. Meanwhile, new wall calendars have been distributed to schools and centres while the 2008-09 high school guide will be sent out to all Grade 6 students.

**CBC SCHOOL NEEDS:** CBC Television's News at Six, Radio One's Homerun (88.5 FM), the Foundation of Greater Montreal (FGM), the Alexander Dworkin Foundation (ADF), the EMSB, the Lester B. Pearson School Board (LBPSB), the Riverside School

Board, the Sir Wilfrid Laurier School Board, the National Film Board of Canada (NFB), Equiterre and the Earth Values Institute (EVI) are proud partners in the CBC School Needs Project 2008.

The School Needs Project was created in 2007 out of the CBC Montreal Matters project to help meet a need at an elementary school that could not be met through its normal operating budget. Each year, the CBC School Needs project follows up on the previous year's Montreal Matters topic. This means that for 2008, students will be developing projects related to the environment. Two schools were selected to participate by each school board, with the EMSB represented by For the EMSB, St. Monica in N.D.G. and East Hill in Rivière-des-Prairies

Each school received a visit from either Equiterre or the Earth Values Institute, as well as the NFB and CBC to help educate and motivate the student in the possibilities of an environmental project in their school and community.

The projects for participating schools were determined by the students themselves with the support of a teacher. Students benefit from this project on many levels, from the educational, community and growth experience, to the concrete results of receiving services or equipment that help them as well as leaving a legacy for future students. The total cost of each proposed project is limited to between \$1,000 and \$2,500.

In terms of the proposal judging process, students were selected from secondary schools of each board to join the FGM's Youth in Philanthropy program and serve as judges for School Needs. **Maria Scotto** of John F. Kennedy High School in St. Michel is the EMSB rep in this category.

The FGM and ADF have each committed \$5,000 for this project. This funded school environmental visits, provided \$500 in up-front funding for project development to each school and grant funds for the most

compelling projects, as identified by the project judges.

Students from each elementary school have already presented a short case for support which will air on *CBC News at Six* and *Homerun* in September

**PASS OR FAIL:** As the school year kicks into gear across the country, CBC News (Radio, Television and [CBCnews.ca](http://CBCnews.ca)) airs *Pass or Fail: Education for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century*. Starting Monday, Sept. 1, the week-long series probes whether Canadian students are getting what they need to survive and thrive.

**ETHICS AND RELIGIOUS CULTURE:** The 2007-2008 school year marked the last year that the Catholic Moral and Religious Education (CMRE), Protestant Moral and Religious Education (PMRE) and Moral Education (ME) courses were offered at EMSB schools. They will be replaced by the new Ethics and Religious Culture (ERC) program, which will be implemented in September 2008. This program does not include any faith-based instruction and is non-denominational. Under the Basic School Regulation, it is stipulated that the Ethics and Religious Culture course is compulsory at the primary and secondary levels.

Pedagogical Services held two days of training last year on board-wide regional pedagogical days in order to allow teachers to become familiar with the ERC program before the implementation date. These training sessions were animated by a team of 12 facilitators consisting of pedagogical consultants and teachers at both the elementary and secondary levels who had received ongoing professional development and support from the MELS and EMSB Pedagogical Services over the last two years. Thanks to this team, approximately 740 elementary and high school teachers were able to attend these well received training sessions.

Last spring, the ERC program was presented to the elementary and high school principals and a presentation was also offered to members of the Education and Facilities Committee. An information session, animated by MELS representatives, was provided to some members of Governing Boards. An information kit designed for Governing Boards and parents was sent from the MELS to every school. In addition, parents also received a brochure informing them about the new ERC course.

**BILL 101 EXPERT RETIRES:** Quietly over the summer **Pat D'Ornellas**, who worked for many years in the EMSB Bill 101 Registration Office retired. Pat is a special person who showed so much patience and compassion for the many families who came to meet her each year in pursuit of a certificate of eligibility for English education. "It was humbling to experience the trust and confidence at the Board and with school personnel for many years," she said. "I will miss the contacts with so many people from probably every country in our small world. And no. I have not lost my enthusiasm or passion for fighting Law 101, only my energy." She retired after 29 years of service to the EMSB and the former Protestant School Board of Greater Montreal.

Le mandat du comité sera de : communiquer les sujets et les intérêts des élèves de la CSEM, améliorer les communications entre l'école et la communauté, explorer des solutions qui produiront un environnement scolaire enrichi, développer des habiletés de leadership, participer au processus de consultation de la CSEM et représenter les élèves de la CSEM par le biais de recommandations au conseil des commissaires.

**PUBLICATIONS :** Une édition spéciale du 10<sup>e</sup> anniversaire de *EMSB Express* sera bientôt envoyée aux écoles pour distribution. Elle est déjà affichée aux sections Nouvelles et 10<sup>e</sup> anniversaire du site Web de la CSEM. En outre, de nouveaux calendriers muraux ont été distribués aux écoles et centres tandis que le guide 2008-2009 des écoles secondaires sera envoyé à tous les élèves de 6<sup>e</sup> année.

**ÉTHIQUE ET CULTURE RELIGIEUSE :** L'année scolaire 2007-2008 a marqué la fin des cours d'enseignement moral et religieux catholique (EMRC), d'enseignement moral et religieux protestante (EMRP) et d'enseignement moral (EM) dispensés dans les écoles de la CSEM. Ils seront remplacés par le nouveau programme Éthique et culture religieuse (ÉCR) qui sera mis en place en septembre 2008. Ce programme n'inclut pas d'instruction religieuse et il est non confessionnel. Le Régime pédagogique stipule

que le cours d'Éthique et de culture religieuse est obligatoire au primaire et au secondaire.

L'an dernier, les Services pédagogiques ont offert deux journées pédagogiques de formation à l'échelle de la Commission pour permettre aux enseignant(e)s de se familiariser avec le programme ÉCR avant la date de mise en œuvre. Ces sessions de formation ont été animées par une équipe de 12 conseillers pédagogiques et d'enseignants du niveau primaire et secondaire qui avaient obtenu perfectionnement professionnel et soutien du MELS et des Services pédagogiques de la CSEM au cours des deux années précédentes. Grâce à cette équipe, près de 740 enseignant(e)s du primaire et du secondaire ont été en mesure d'assister à ces sessions de formation.

Au printemps dernier, le programme ÉCR a été présenté aux directions des écoles primaires et secondaires ainsi qu'aux membres du comité des affaires pédagogiques et des services éducatifs. Une session d'information animée par des représentants du MELS a aussi été offerte à certains membres des conseils d'établissement. Une trousse d'information conçue pour les conseils d'établissement et les parents a été envoyée par le MELS à chaque école. En outre, les parents ont aussi reçu une brochure détaillant le nouveau cours ÉCR.

**GANGS DE RUES :** *The Big Step* est une équipe de conseillers qui se spécialisent en prévention des gangs de rues. Ils offrent des séminaires dans les écoles pour enseigner aux jeunes et aux parents comment éviter de se joindre ou devenir des victimes des gangs de rues. Les services incluent un discours, un mini-documentaire sur vidéo sur les rues et présentant des parents qui ont perdu des enfants suite à la violence des gangs de rues. Des livres de bandes dessinées donnant des exemples de la vie dans les rues et des résultats des choix adoptés sont distribués. Le livre de bandes dessinées est présenté en noir et blanc et donne aux élèves l'occasion de

Nous croyons que nous pouvons aider à réduire ce stress en inculquant la compréhension et la confiance requises afin qu'ils soient en mesure d'avoir un meilleur rendement lorsqu'ils passent des examens ou des entrevues. Nous offrons une vaste gamme d'options afin d'aider votre enfant à acquérir les habiletés requises pour donner son meilleur rendement pour ces examens et entrevues éprouvants. »
