Term 1

By October 7th, students will be issued a **Progress Report Card** with comments on their learning progress, behavior, and subject-specific competencies. By **November 20**, students will have been issued a Report Card.

Students will be assessed on their knowledge and understanding of the whole first unit, and the beginning of the second unit of the course in an examination-like context:

- 1. The formation of the Canadian federal system, from 1840-1896
- 2. Nationalisms and the autonomy of Canada, from 1896-1945

Term 2

Students will write mid-year exams that will count for 20% of their term marks. By March 15, students will be issued a Report Card.

Term 3

At the end of term, students will be given MEQ Exams during the examination period. Students will receive their Final Report Card on June 23.

Students will be assessed on their knowledge and understanding of all four units of the course in a MEES examination (the above two, plus the two listed below):

- 1. The modernization of Quebec and the Quiet Revolution, from 1945-1980
- 2. Societal choices in contemporary Quebec, from 1980 present day
